(5) PENSIONS FOR SURVIVING SPOUSES:

The UMWA 1985 Construction Workers Pension Plan provides for Surviving Spouse pensions. Benefits for an eligible surviving spouse will be payable in accord-

ange with the following:

(a) If, on or after the effective date of this Agreement, a working construction worker dies (regardless of cause) and would have been eligible for an immediate pension had the construction worker retired on the date of death, the surviving spouse will be eligible for a pension equal to 75% of the pension the construction worker would have received, and will receive this pension until death. Such surviving spouse will be entitled to retain a Health Services card until death
