I hope you will consider all the lives that will be affected if you let Patriot coal take away the health care my wife an I depend on so much without my health care there would be no money for food or medicine that we need. My wife's diabetic medicine would cost us seven hundred dollars for a three months supply an I have to go to my eye doctor more often than you probably would so you see we really depend a lot on my having the health care that Patriot agreed to provide for it's working miner's and it's retiree's and their spouse's and their children. If Patriot wins this case then there are going to be not hundreds, but thousands of people that are going to suffer or worse if they cannot afford their medical needs. We are relying on you to make the right decision and protect the one's who worked so hard and earned the much needed health
