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

# Statebriefs

## Port coalition gets bonding authority

SHEPHERDSTOWN — A coalition working to establish an inland port in West Virginia's Eastern Panhandle now has the authority to issue bonds.

The West Virginia Public Port Authority's board unanimously voted Wednesday to give the Eastern Panhandle Inland Port Coalition bonding authority. The Journal reports that the decision came during a board meeting in Shepherdstown.

Bonding authority is considered critical to the inland port initiative's success.

The proposed port would include the Eastern Regional Airport, several business and industrial parks and the B&O Roundhouse complex.

In March, the coalition hired Richmond, Va.-based Moreland Property Group to study the proposed port's feasibility, construction and financing.

Moreland president Brad Rogers says the study will be completed by October.

## US seeks to protect rare fish, habitat

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has proposed protecting a rare fish called the diamond darter and more than 120 miles of its Elk River habitat in West Virginia and Kentucky.

The nonprofit Center for Biological Diversity said Wednesday that the decision stems from a legal settlement that would speed decisions on Endangered Species Act protections for more than 750 species.

The diamond darter was considered extinct until scientists rediscovered it in West Virginia in 1980. Fewer than 50 of them have been collected over the past 30 years.

Mountaintop-removal coal mining, oil and gas extraction and untreated sewage are among threats to the diamond darter.

Wednesday's action proposes to protect the darters' critical habitat in West Virginia's Kanawha and Clay counties and Edmonson, Hart and Green counties in Kentucky.

## Federal law limits oversight of school

A Higher Education Policy Commission official says a federal law prevented the state from intervening on behalf of veteran students when problems surfaced at Mountain State University.

Skip Gebhart coordinates veterans education and training programs. He said that the 2010 law left the commission powerless to help veterans attending the university.

A provision in the law took away state officials' authority to withdraw approval of Veterans Affairs benefits at accredited nonprofit colleges and universities if their educational programs were lacking.

Gebhart says the commission could have addressed Mountain State's approval for VA benefits a year ago, if not for the law.

The Higher Education Learning Commission revoked Mountain State's accreditation in June but decided this week to extend it until Dec. 31 while the school appeals.

## Tomblin thanks food drive donors

Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin is thanking contributors who helped replenish the state's food pantries after recent storms left thousands of people without electricity.

Tomblin said Thursday that the Mountaineer Food Bank and the Huntington Area Food Bank have received more than \$147,000 and five truckloads of food collected during statewide food drives this month. The food banks will distribute the donations to food pantries across the state.

Tomblin says in a news release that contributions came from hundreds of individuals, families, businesses and community organizations.

They include a Wheeling woman who sent \$2 to Tomblin, all that she could spare. Tomblin says people like her embody the West Virginia spirit of neighbor helping neighbor.

# Sheetz says more stores are possible

As they marked the opening of the company's latest location in West Virginia, officials with Sheetz Convenience Stores said more stores could open in the Kanawha Valley.

Sheetz officials on Thursday cut the ribbon for the company's 425th store, located along Teays Valley Road in Scott Depot.

The Altoona, Pa.-based company currently has locations in six states. Company executives want to expand further in West Virginia.

"We are in West Virginia looking at sites at least one day a week every week," Sheetz real estate director David Hazelet said Thursday. "It's getting some pretty heavy attention."

The popular convenience store and gas station chain is well known for its Made To Order food brand that includes hot and cold sandwiches, pizza and wraps.

The Scott Depot location is the company's 40th store in West Virginia.

"We've earmarked what we've called the east-west route and the north-south route," he said.

The east-west route is the Interstate 64 corridor from Huntington to Charleston, and the north-south route runs from Charleston through Beckley.

Hazelet said the company is seriously considering locations at exits along both corridors.

"There's still continued search every day for sites in those areas," he said.

He said the company opens 30 to 35 locations each year across the six states in which it already operates.

He said there are several sites in West Virginia that are under agreement to be future locations, but he declined to say where those sites were Thursday.

Hazelet said he didn't want to name the sites because there is an extensive permitting process.

Permits have to be cleared by both local planning and zoning commissions as well as the state Department of Environmental Protection.

It can take six months to more than two years to open a location, depending on the permitting process.

"There are so many approvals and design issues anymore, some of them take just a while to get built,"

Hazelet said.

The company is almost finished building its next West Virginia location in the Clarksburg area.

In addition to the potential sites in the Charleston area,

Hazelet said the company is considering more locations along the Clarksburg-to-Morgantown Interstate 79 corridor.

ANAHEIM, Calif. — As police around City Hall tried to quell rock-hurling protesters angry over two deadly police shootings, the night sky exploded with splendid bursts of green and orange from Disneyland fireworks a few miles away. Pyrotechnic booms trailed popping sounds as officers in riot gear fired pepper balls and bean bags at protesters.

The contrasting scenes were reflective of the two Anaheims that were on display this week. One is a magical tourist destination, and the other is a place where shifting demographics have left a large segment of the population feeling like second-class citizens.

"This is not quite 'The Happiest Place on Earth,' and now the world knows it," said Jose Hernandez, referencing Disneyland's motto. "It's great if you live in the hills, but if you live right around the corner from 'The Happiest Place on Earth' you realize it's a whole different ball game."

The 27-year-old community organizer, who grew up in Anaheim, made the statement to the City Council as raucous protests raged outside Tuesday night.

Two fatal police shootings last weekend — one of an unarmed man police say was a known gang member — roiled the city and exposed its divisions. Demonstrators took to the streets four nights in a row.

Tuesday's was the largest and most violent protest, with some of the nearly 600 demonstrators hurling rocks and bottles at police, who made two dozen arrests. About 20 businesses were damaged.

The city has asked federal authorities to investigate the shootings.

Both victims were Hispanic, as were most of the demonstrators. The city, about 90 percent white in 1970, now has a population that is 53 percent Hispanic.

Last month, the American Civil Liberties Union sued the city, alleging that Anaheim's at-large elections have weakened Latinos' voting power. The suit claims only three councilmen-

bers in the city's history have been Hispanic. Most of the City Council currently hails from the city's upscale neighborhoods to the east.

"So much attention has been paid to building up the resort district and somehow those resources would trickle down to the rest of the city and we're just not seeing it," said Jose Moreno, president of Los Amigos of Orange County and a plaintiff in the lawsuit. "A lot of us are saying enough is enough and this police shooting is really just emblematic of something more systemic in the politics of the city."

While it's known worldwide as the home of Disneyland, the reality is Anaheim is much more

than a theme park. It's a big city — the population is 336,000, about the same as Tampa, Fla., and Honolulu — and it has big-city problems. There is great wealth for some, but a large segment of the population lives in or at the edge of poverty.

Those differences can be seen in the tony, hilltop homes in the east to the rundown areas like Anna Street, where some residents shrug off the presence of gangs so long as they're left alone. It's a far cry from the place filled with orange groves that Walt Disney chose for his theme park in the 1950s because it had so much open space.

Since then, the city has been a magnet for tourists flocking to

see Mickey Mouse or attend an event at the massive convention center touted as the largest on the West Coast. There is professional baseball with the Angels and pro hockey with the Ducks, whose original name Mighty Ducks name came from — what else? — a Disney film. More than 17 million people visited Anaheim last year and spent nearly \$4.6 billion.

Few ever see much of the city, however. Visitors to the neatly manicured theme park or Angel Stadium can reach their destinations by zipping off the freeway and into a parking lot without passing through the city's residential neighborhoods. Tourism officials have been in

close contact with the city since the unrest.

On Wednesday, the Anaheim/Orange County Visitor & Convention Bureau was quick to reassure visitors the city is safe and pointed out the recent police incidents didn't take place in the area where Disneyland and the convention center are located.

Gene Jeffers, executive director of the Themed Entertainment Association, said some area residents might put off visiting the resort in the next few days but he doesn't see any real effect on tourism — especially not on those who hail from out of town.

"There's a pretty big buffer zone around the park," said Jeffers, whose organization repre-

sents theme park designers and developers.

Mayor Tom Tait warned the city would take swift action to stop any additional violence. He also noted the violence occurred far from tourist hubs.

Local activists have complained that officials spend too much time worrying about image for tourists and on big-time developers, but not enough on housing and services for its people.

Critics have blasted city officials for extending a tax break to a Disneyland-area hotel developer and want to change elections in Anaheim to make officials more accountable to local districts.

They have also demanded an independent investigation into recent police shootings — which officials had agreed to seek even before the weekend's events pushed the total number of fatal police shootings to six this year.

On Saturday, a police officer fatally shot Manuel Diaz outside an Anna Street apartment complex. Officers say Diaz, who had a criminal record, failed to heed orders and threw something as he fled police. The city's police union said Diaz reached for his waistband, which led the officer to believe he was drawing a gun.

Diaz's family, which is suing for \$50 million in damages, says he was shot in the leg and the back of the head. During a protest the night of the shooting, a police dog escaped and bit a bystander.

On Sunday night, police shot to death Joel Acevedo, a suspected gang member they say fired at officers after a pursuit.

Veronica Rodarte, a 25-year-old social services program coordinator, said she is well aware of the problems with gang violence and police in the city where she's lived her entire life. But she doesn't like how residents' outrage, even if justified, has turned violent.

"We are very upset with the portrayals our city is getting and the violence that is erupting in our city," she said. "Throwing rocks and rioting and setting trash bins on fire is not going to help us move forward."

## Woman's wedding ring found 4 years later

When she lost her diamond wedding ring four years ago, Nelia Rasmussen held out hope for several months before finally buying a replacement. But she never stopped missing the one that got away.

Earlier this week, she nearly fell over from joy when she was reunited with the platinum Princess cut diamond ring that washed up on an Idaho lake shore and was found by a kayaker four years after it went missing.

Rasmussen, 34, said she started crying when she claimed the ring after describing it in great detail and providing a photograph.

"I mean, what are the chances?" Rasmussen told The Associated Press on Thursday.

Rasmussen was at Rigby Lake near Idaho Falls four years ago when she took the ring off so

she could rub sunscreen on her children. She placed the ring inside a chair's cup holder for safe keeping and thinks that it later fell out later when she was folding up the chair.

The loss was particularly upsetting because Rasmussen had recently learned that her husband, Heber, an Army reservist, was going to be deployed to Iraq. He had picked out the ring and it was platinum, just like his mother's wedding ring.

His mother also lost her wedding ring and it was found about three decades later, Rasmussen said.

"Thirty years later, his dad found it in the garden," she said.

In her case, she found herself reluctant to replace the ring that near Idaho Falls four years ago when she took the ring off so

couragement. "I was having a hard time getting a new one," she said. "I just wanted my old one back."

The ring remained missing until Monday, when Emily Geisler spotted it while kayaking.

The story was first reported in the Rexburg Standard Journal. Geisler told the newspaper she hadn't been kayaking in a while and was practicing getting in and out of the watercraft on the shore when the ring caught her eye.

Geisler announced her finding at a meeting of the Rigby Rotary Club late Tuesday, after the group had finished its business. The announcement caught the attention of Rasmussen's brother-in-law, Glenn Walker, a fellow Rotary Club member.

"He happened to remember me and my sister talking about

my ring missing a year ago," Rasmussen said.



DENVER — As police officers pleaded for all available medics to converge on the scene of the Colorado movie theater massacre last week, a two-man ambulance crew and their rig were idling just a few miles away.
While some ambulances were quickly called to duty, it took dispatchers more than 20 minutes into the crisis to ask the Cunningham Fire Protection District and other nearby agencies to provide aid at the multiplex in the Denver suburb of Aurora.
By the time the Cunning-

ham crew arrived, it was more than a half hour after authorities got first word that a gunman opened fire at a packed midnight showing of "The Dark Knight Rises," killing 12 people and injuring dozens of others.
Radio traffic from last Friday showed emergency personnel struggling to grasp both the scope of the tragedy and mobilize a response. The ambulance delays came during crucial minutes for the injured victims, though it's not clear whether a faster

response would have saved more lives.
Officials have declined so far to release call records of the response, and the Aurora Fire Department declined to discuss the handling of ambulances from that night.
Experienced emergency responders say no response will ever be perfect. Residents in the Denver area are well aware of the turmoil that comes with mass tragedies, as police were criticized in 1999 for waiting outside Columbine High School instead of immediately pursuing two gunmen who went on a killing rampage inside.

Ohio man pleads guilty in bath salts case

WHEELING — An Ohio man is the first person to be convicted in West Virginia on federal bath salts distribution charges.
U.S. Attorney William Ihlenfeld said 35-year-old Steven Kohl, of Columbus, Ohio, pleaded guilty Wednesday to aiding and abetting interstate travel in aid of a racketeer-

ing enterprise.
The charge stems from Kohl's role in bringing the synthetic drugs to Tyler County from Columbus in September 2011.
Ihlenfeld said Kohl is the first bath salts dealer convicted on federal charges in West Virginia. But he said synthetic drugs are now a major problem in the state and this won't be the last case.
A sentencing date hasn't been set. Kohl faces up to five years in prison and a \$250,000 fine.

Police arrest 9 in generator thefts

State police said in a release Thursday that authorities have recovered five of 39 reported stolen generators, which has resulted in nine people being charged with the theft and possession of the machines. A warrant is out for the arrest of another person.

services, said there have been 559 inspections since March, when the ban went into effect. Of those, roughly 11 were due to complaints.
According to a summary, the most frequent violation was not posting "no smoking" signs at the door — 110 of those were noted. Six violations were issued for people smoking in non-smoking areas.
Business owners also asked the board how they were supposed to deal with patrons who refuse to comply.
Mary Stanley, owner of Just One More, in Blacksburg, said

she worried about getting shot at or assaulted while enforcing the regulation. "I'm not going to have a confrontation like that with someone when I ask them nicely to leave."
Chairman Sam Chico said he can't encourage people to put themselves in a potentially violent situation to enforce the ban. Confronting people who are under the influence could be dangerous, he said. "We need people to police themselves and be respectful human beings."
Christina Mickey, project coordinator for Smoke-Free West Virginia, suggested anyone who felt intim-

idated or threatened should call the police.
Becky Sperandio, a county resident, said she used to patronize local bars but now she has to go to places in Pennsylvania to drink and smoke. She gave the board a petition with 3,300 signatures, calling for the ban to be reversed.
Michelle Stevens, with the American Cancer Society, said she's been enjoying smoke-free dining and entertainment. "Thank you for protecting us from secondhand smoke."
Also at Thursday's meeting, the board voted to raise fees for some nursing services the health department offers. For example, the cost of a

pap smear went from \$15.50 to \$25, a pregnancy test went from \$5 to \$10, and a complete gynecological physical for a new patient went from \$75 to \$125.
Executive Director Jim Strohsider said the sliding fee scale — which is based on income — would still be available for those who need it.
The health department hasn't raised those fees for awhile, he said, and the increase will help cover operational costs.
In other business, the board decided to wait to elect officers until the County Commission reappoints Tennant or appoints a new member. Tennant's term expired June 30.

rich Strip District.
"It's just a matter of making sure you're properly doing things," he said. "You're going to do that, anyway."
From now through MountainFest's wrap on Sunday, Mon County will have four inspectors, known as "sanitarians," making spot checks of MountainFest vendors and any other business catering to motorcyclists during the festival.
There are at least 17 food vendors and eight tattoo artists set up at MountainFest, and all are subject to a full litany of local, state and federal regulations.
That means making sure working conditions are clean

and up to code. That means making sure water and sewer hookups are properly working. Same deal for portable toilets.
"There's a lot you have to do," said Joe Demus, whose Demus Italian Specialty Foods is a fixture at the festival. "We ship our product everywhere in the country, so it's the same deal."
Jon Welch's three-word answer set the terms of the deal Thursday afternoon for the Mon County Health Department.

# Gas hits \$3.50 a gallon

Gasoline is at \$3.50 per gallon for the first time this summer after a sharp run-up in July.

The price of gas gained 17 cents per gallon, or 5.1 percent this month. It was the first monthly increase since March. The nationwide average was last at \$3.50 per gallon June 19.

Drivers had enjoyed a long stretch of declining prices at the pump as oil fell from more than \$100 per barrel in March to below \$78 by late June. The aver-

age price at the pump fell by 60 cents per gallon in about three months. But oil rose 13 percent from its June low on renewed concerns of supply disruptions in the Middle East and the usual increase in demand in the warmer months. Oil ended July at \$88.05 per barrel.

The rising cost of ethanol also boosted gas prices, AAA said. Ethanol prices have jumped because of record high corn prices. Most fuel sold for passenger cars and pickups today is 10 percent ethanol and 90 percent gas.

# Iran, al-Qaida, Taliban told to pay \$6B for 9/11

NEW YORK — Al-Qaida, the Taliban and Iran should pay \$6 billion to relatives of Sept. 11 victims for aiding in the 2001 terror attacks, a federal magistrate judge recommended Monday in a largely symbolic decision.

Even though it will be nearly impossible to collect damages, plaintiff Ellen Saracini, whose husband, Victor, was the captain of one of the planes that struck the World Trade Center, said that she is happy

about Manhattan Federal Magistrate Judge Frank Maas' recommendation.

"It's hard being happy, but I am happy about it," said Saracini, of Yardley, Pa. "But it opens up old wounds. We were never in it for a lawsuit. I wanted to know what happened to my husband."

Last year, Judge George Daniels signed a default judgment on the lawsuit brought by relatives of 47 victims. He found al-Qaida, the Taliban and Iran liable.

# Facebook stock hits another low after earnings

Facebook's stock is at another all-time low.

The stock has been falling since Facebook released quarterly earnings Thursday for the first time as a public company. Investors were disappointed despite second-quarter results meeting Wall Street expectations, with revenue one-third higher than last year.

The stock lost \$1.44, or 6.2 percent, to close Tuesday at \$21.71. It is 43 percent below its initial public offering price of \$38. Shares briefly hit \$21.61 during the day. The previous low was \$22.28, on Friday.

# Fannie-Freddie can't reduce principal

WASHINGTON — A federal regulator is standing by its decision to bar Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac from reducing principal for borrowers at risk of foreclosure, resisting pressure from the Obama administration.

The Federal Housing Finance Agency announced the decision Tuesday after months of considering the option.

The agency's acting director, Edward DeMarco, has long opposed allowing Fannie and Freddie to offer principal reduction.

DeMarco said an extensive analysis by the FHFA found the potential benefit was too small compared with the costs and risks.

All prime contractors, subcontractors, small, minority or women owned enterprises and other interested parties are invited to attend.

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The Project will be constructed in one (1) contract

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to file a Proof of Claim. If your claim is not listed at all or if your claim is listed as disputed, contingent, or unliquidated, then you must file a Proof of Claim or you might not be paid any money on your claim and may be unable to vote on a plan. The Bankruptcy Court has not yet set a deadline to file a Proof of Claim. If a deadline is set, you will be sent another notice. A secured creditor retains rights in its collateral regardless of whether that creditor files a Proof of Claim. Filing a Proof of Claim may submit the creditor to the jurisdiction of the Bankruptcy Court, with consequences a lawyer can explain. For example, a secured creditor who files a Proof of Claim may surrender important nonmonetary rights, including the right to a jury trial.

**Filing Deadline for a Creditor with a Foreign Address:** The deadline for filing claims will be 30 days after the date of the Bankruptcy Court order and will apply to all creditors with a foreign address. If notice of the order setting the deadline is sent to a creditor at a foreign address, the creditor may file a motion requesting the Bankruptcy Court to extend the deadline. There is no assurance that such a motion would be granted.





## ECB vows to protect euro; stocks soar

NEW YORK (AP) — It was the buy signal that markets were waiting for.

When European Central Bank president Mario Draghi vowed to "do whatever it takes" to keep the continent's monetary union intact, stocks were off to races in the U.S. and Europe.

The Dow Jones industrial average on Thursday jumped 212 points, or 1.7 percent, to 12,888 following big gains in European markets. Benchmark stock indexes in Spain and Italy surged 6 percent and 4 percent in France.

Draghi's comments at an investor conference at the Olympics raised hopes that Europe's central bank might intervene to bring down the crippling-

ly high borrowing costs for struggling European countries like Spain and Italy.

After insisting for months that it was up to European governments to restore confidence in the currency shared by 17 nations there, Draghi pledged that "the ECB is ready to do whatever it takes to preserve the euro."

That commitment gave a big boost to global markets. "The No. 1 problem in the world now is Europe's finances," John Fox, director of research at Fenimore Asset Management, said. "When the head of the ECB comes out and says he's willing to do anything, that's code for 'We are going to agree to resolve this issue.'"

# Lifting barriers key in HIV fight

Research and treatment alone face limits in the effort to stop spread of the virus.

**WASHINGTON** • For all the strides made against HIV, the virus that causes AIDS, science and medicine alone can't end an epidemic that affects vulnerable populations disproportionately: minorities, young people, poor people and those who lack access to health care.

The International AIDS Conference taking place this week in Washington brims with hope about breakthroughs in treatment and care that allow people with HIV to live longer and healthier lives. Researchers talk optimistically about a vaccine and a cure.

But because of persistent social, cultural and economic barriers, the most at-risk groups don't receive enough of the treatment and support necessary to save their own lives and prevent the spread of the virus, health providers and community organizations say.

"The science of HIV and treatment is coming along, and everyone is excited," said Yvette Calderon, the adult urgent-care director at Jacobi Medical Center in New York. "We forget there's a real-life implementation that has to occur."

What 30 years ago was a disease that primarily affected white gay men now has a significant effect on far more populations, including gay and bisexual black and Latino men and heterosexual black women. And while HIV is still considered a big-city problem, it affects impoverished rural communities at an alarming rate.

According to the Kaiser Family Foundation, blacks are eight times more likely to contract HIV than whites are. Black women are 15 times more likely to become infected than white women. Black youths are 10 times more at risk for HIV than their white counterparts are.

Unlike 30 years ago, HIV no longer means near-certain death. But the groups most likely to be infected with HIV are the least likely to get treatment. They're the least likely to have health insurance. And they're the most likely to die of AIDS complications.

"No one should have to die of HIV anymore," said Janet Weinberg, chief operating officer of the Gay Men's Health Crisis, a New York-based advocacy group founded in the earliest days of the epidemic. "But we're not going to be able to get to that point in silence."

Sometimes the barriers are cultural. Traditional, conservative families and communities may be reluctant to have frank conversations about uncomfortable subjects, especially when it comes to young people.

"It's hard to talk about sex and sexuality, especially in churches," said Shavon Arline-Bradley, the director of health programs for the NAACP. The nation's oldest civil rights organization spent three years developing an AIDS manual for churches, the heart of social life for many African-Americans.

Arline-Bradley said physicians should think about HIV the same way as other conditions that affect minorities. Black women and teens, for example, may vastly underestimate their risk of infection.

"You should not have to ask for an HIV test," she said. "It should be part of routine care."

# Aging with AIDS

Survivors may be suffering health problems typically seen in older adults.

**WASHINGTON** • AIDS is graying. By the end of the decade, the government estimates, more than half of Americans living with HIV will be over 50. Even in developing countries, more people with the AIDS virus are surviving to middle age and beyond.

That's good news — but it's also a challenge. There's growing evidence that people who have spent decades battling the virus may be aging prematurely. At the International AIDS Conference this week, numerous studies are examining how heart disease, thinning bones and a list of other health problems typically seen in the senior years seem to hit many people with HIV when they're only in their 50s.

"I'm 54, but I feel older," said Carolynn Massey of Laurel, Md., who has lived with HIV for nearly 20 years.

"When I hear young people talk about, 'Well you get HIV and you take your drugs and you'll be all right' — that's just not the truth," she said. The graying isn't just because people such as Massey are surviving longer. Some of it comes from older adults' being newly diagnosed, a trend U.S. health officials say is small but slowly growing. Yes, grandparents still have sex — and that's an age group missed by all those hip safe-sex messages aimed at teens and 20-somethings.

"They let down their guard," is how Dr. Kevin Fenton of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention puts it.

Already, a third of the nearly 1.2 million people living with HIV in the U.S. are over 50, and by 2020 half will be, Fenton said at one of numerous sessions on aging at the world's largest AIDS meeting.

People 50 or older accounted for 17 percent of new HIV diagnoses in 2009, according to the CDC's latest data. That's up from 13 percent in 2001.

There aren't as good counts in poor regions of the world, where access to lifesaving medications came years later than in developed countries.

But even in hard-hit sub-Saharan Africa, home to most of the world's HIV-infected population, studies suggest 3 million people living with HIV are 50-plus, said Dr. Joel Negin of the University of Sydney in Australia. By 2040, he said, that could reach 9 million.

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
