My name is Nancy Campbell, William Campbell is my Husband 48 years, He worked in the Peabody mine #10 for 29 years.

I am writing this letter to let you know that the VMR (Patrol Coal) health insurance is a matter of life and death. The pension is almost a matter of life and death.

Bill worked at the face in Peabody coal mine #10 for 29 years. Most of that time the dust was so bad he could not see 10 feet. The dust masks they supplied would stop up in 10 minutes.

He worked half that time as a roof bolter. At that job he drilled a hole in the roof, placed glue sticks in the hole - then a roof bolt which broke the glue sticks. - This is the same glue you are warned to only use in a well

renacted area. He spent 8 hours a day sniffing glue.

Bill's health is very bad. He takes a lot of medicines because of his job at Peabody #10 coal mine.

His Medicines are: Furosemide - Clorazepate Dipotassium - PARoxetine - Donepezil - Simvastatin - Aspirin - Magnesium - Multi-Vitamin - Nasacort - Namenda - Spiriva HandiHaler - Axona - Metoprolol - Lisinopril - Advair Diskus 500/50 - Benzonatate - Levemir - ProAir HFE 108 - Novolog

The pension is \$535.⁰⁰ a month. Most of that is used for co-pays for Doctor appointments and fuel to get there.

Bill retired early (55 years old) because he was not able to do the work.

When you make your decision in this case please consider the miners were promised Health insurance and pensions for them and their family for life.
