

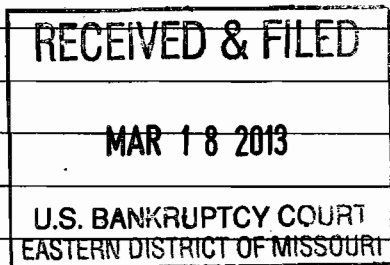
Honorable Kathy A. Surratt - States

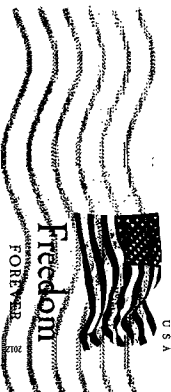
