**STIPULATION AND ORDER REGARDING CLAIMS OF DOROTHY BAILES,
JOHNNIE D. MUCK, AND LAWRENCE ECHOLS IN CONNECTION WITH
THE DEBTORS' FIRST OMNIBUS OBJECTION TO CLAIMS**

Patriot Coal Corporation and its subsidiaries that are debtors in these jointly-administered cases (collectively, the “Debtors”) and Dorothy Bailes, Johnnie D. Muck, and Lawrence Echols, individually and, as applicable, in their capacities as personal representatives of certain estates (collectively, the “Creditors”), hereby stipulate and agree as follows.

1. On April 19, 2013, the Debtors filed their First Omnibus Objection to Claims (Duplicate Claims) [Docket No. 3742] (the “Objection”). Capitalized terms not defined herein have the meanings set forth in the Objection.

2. In the Objection, the Debtors proposed to disallow and expunge Claim No. 2747 (GCG Claim No. 2298), which was filed by Creditor Dorothy Bailes on behalf of the estate of Huston Bailes, on the ground that the claim was duplicative of Claim No. 2746 (GCG Claim No. 2309), which was filed by Creditor Dorothy Bailes on her own behalf. Claim Nos. 2747 and 2746 are referred to collectively in this Stipulation as the “Bailes Claims.”

3. The Debtors also proposed to disallow and expunge Claim No. 3241 (GCG Claim No. 2286), which was filed by Creditor Johnnie D. Muck on behalf of the estate of Louella Muck, on the ground that the claim was duplicative of Claim No. 1466 (GCG Claim No. 2287), which was filed by Creditor Johnnie D. Muck on behalf of the estate of Louella Muck. Claim Nos. 3241 and 1466 are referred to collectively in this Stipulation as the “Muck Claims.”

4. The Debtors further proposed to disallow and expunge Claim No. 1462 (GCG Claim No. 2261), which was filed by Creditor Lawrence Echols on his own behalf, on the ground that the claim was duplicative of Claim No. 3694 (GCG Claim No. 2262), which was filed by Creditor Lawrence Echols on his own behalf. Claim Nos. 1462 and 3694 are referred to collectively in this Stipulation as the “Echols Claims.”

5. Because of the different capacities in which Creditor Dorothy Bailes filed the Bailes Claims, the Bailes Claims are not duplicative of one another.

6. The Objection is WITHDRAWN as to the Bailes Claims.

7. The Muck Claims are duplicative of one another.


8. The Objection is SUSTAINED as to the Muck Claims. Claim No. 3241 (GCG Claim No. 2286) is hereby disallowed. The Clerk of the Court and the Debtors’ claims agent are hereby directed to reflect the disallowance of this claim in their respective records. Nothing herein shall affect the right of any party in interest to object to Claim No. 1466 (GCG Claim No. 2287) on any appropriate grounds.

9. The Echols Claims are duplicative of one another.

10. The Objection is SUSTAINED as to the Echols Claims. Claim No. 1462 (GCG Claim No. 2261) is hereby disallowed. The Clerk of the Court and the Debtors’ claims agent are hereby directed to reflect the disallowance of this claim in their respective records. Nothing

herein shall affect the right of any party in interest to object to Claim No. 3694 (GCG Claim No. 2262) on any appropriate grounds.

11. Nothing in this Stipulation affects any other claims referenced in the Objection.
