In May 2010 I was diagnosed with Multiple Myeloma cancer. I underwent chemotheraphy and an autologous stem cell transplant that same year. I am still under doctors' care for checkups, periodic blood work and various tests. I depend on these benefits in order to receive the care I need. My wife also depends on my healtcare benefits. She, too, is a cancer survivor.

At this stage of our lives, I thought we would have the healthcare benefits I worked for to see us through retirement. Please take our needs into consideration when making your decision. Thank you.
